Talk on Recruitment & Selection

Mr. Johan D'Silva, Senior Executive Human Resource at the Lalit Golf and Spa Resort, Canacona Goa was the resource person invited to interact with the students of TYBBA-T&T. The interaction was on 17th December 2016 from 9:30 am to 11:30 am.

Mr. Johan started the talk by explaining about the different types of employees which included the industrial trainees, apprentice trainees, contract/ outsourced, daily wages/casual, fixed term contract, confirmed and consultants. He gave us a detailed explanation about each of the above.

He also asked us different questions to make the interaction interesting. Mr. Johan told us to write down the two recruitment sources that is internal and external.

Under internal: Job rotation, promotion, referral, trainees

Under external: Walk-ins, referrals, social media.

The next question asked was 'What is more difficult Recruitment or Selection'. Few of the students said recruitment, others said selection. Finally, he corrected us and said that selection is more difficult, i.e. select right person for the right job.

The next topic discussed was recruitment indicators

- HR Budget (Salary/Position)
- Educational Background
 - Work Experience
- Industry Experience
- Hobbies
- Part time activities
- Achievements
- Family details

All these factors are important before recruiting new staff. Interview: People who will be taking the interview Head of the Department (HOD) who will be asking questions regarding the technical aspect. Human Resource Department who will be asking questions regarding the salary, background, behaviour etc.


They are then sent to the General Manager and at the Corporate level.

There are different types of interviews like Panel, Skype, Telephone and Direct.

He also instructed on what to do when the question 'Tell me something about yourself' is asked. Few points to consider are:-

Do not tell about your personal life. Highlight your personal abilities. The different offers are Pre-joining formalities, list of requirements, designation, acknowledgment. Offers are subjected to Reference checks, legal verification, medical fitness, etc.

Field Trip to Goa Dairy Plant

GOA STATE CO-OPERATIVE MILK PRODUCER'S UNION LTD.

On 16th March 2017 the students of TYBBA (T&T) had a field trip to Goa Dairy. Earlier Goa Dairy was a



government sector undertaking but now it has become a cooperative. They have 12 Board of Directors and 1 Chairman. Main function of Goa Dairy is to collect milk from the farmers then to process, pasteurise, pack and later market to the consumers. In the day time the processing takes place and it is dispatched at night. They collect 67000 liters milk per day. 12000 to 15000 liters milk is brought from other states like Karnataka and Maharashtra. They are having four type of milk brands namely pasteurised cow milk, full cream milk, standardised milk and toned milk. This milk is distinguished based on their fat content. They also have by-products of milk like curds,

lassi, butter, ghee, ice-cream and flavoured milk. If the milk is left than it is processed again. We learned that overall functioning of a Dairy.

From here onwards the entire night was spent traveling to Amritsar, where we checked in at the hotel early in the morning and headed to the Golden Temple, Durgiana Temple which was the replica of the golden temple, and the Jallianwala Bagh. We were also fortunate to witness the lowering of the flags ceremony at the Wagah

border and lastly we were excited with the opportunity to visit the Amritsar market and have encounter the famous delicacy, the "Punjab Lassi' and finally the last destination was Chandigarh where we got our feets to the tunes of some local music on the specially organized DJ night for the students, and the places explored were the Rock Gardens which portrayed wealth out of waste, the sukhna lakefamous for boating and market complex Sector-17 which was dedicated only for shopping.
